

## Janice Dole Bio

Jan is currently a distinguished research fellow at the Center for the School of the Future at Utah State University. She is also professor emeritus of the Reading and Literacy Program in the Educational Psychology Department at the University of Utah.

Her past positions have included appointments at the University of Denver, the Center for the Study of Reading at the University of Illinois and Michigan State University. Her research interests include reading reform, vocabulary and comprehension instruction, and professional development.

Dole's publications include books, test reviews, chapters, and articles in premier journals within the literacy field such as *Reading Research Quarterly*, *Review of Educational Research*, *Journal of Educational Psychology*, *The Elementary School Journal*, *The Reading Teacher*, and *The Journal of Adolescent and Adult Literacy*.

For two decades, she served as a consultant for the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP). She has extensive experience working with teachers, literacy coaches, administrators, and school boards across the country and has served as a regular consultant to state and federal agencies. Dole is a past senior author of Macmillan/McGraw-Hill's *Treasures and Wonders* and an inducted member and past secretary of the prestigious Reading Hall of Fame. Currently, she is working on reading reform in Utah as well as teacher education reform in the Science of Reading.
