



USU M.Ed. Program SCHOOL COUNSELING

Utah State's Department of Psychology homes a master's degree (M.Ed.) program for School Counseling that is nationally accredited by the Association for Advancing Quality in Educator Preparation (AAQEP). This program is designed to prepare students for professional licensure in school counseling and job opportunities in K-12 school counseling positions. Students are trained in subjects including behavioral and educational assessment and intervention, ethical and professional standards, individual, group, and classroom counseling interventions, and college and career readiness. The School Counseling Program offers four study tracks: the Jumpstart Undergraduate Track (2 years, USU undergraduates only), Summer-Start Fast Track (2 years), the Fall-Start Standard Track (3 years), and the Spring-Start Standard Track (2.5 years). ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Completed application through USU School of Graduate Studies to include:

- USBE Criminal Background Check
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.2
- Official transcripts verifying completion of undergraduate degree from accredited institution
- Three letters of recommendation (to be submitted by professional recommenders through the application portal)
- Statement of purpose
- Professional resume
- Video submission

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Complete M.Ed. in School Counseling Program of Study (49 credit hours).
Maintain 3.0 GPA or above, complete all courses with B grade or higher.
Successful completion of Practicum and Internship experiential components.
Pass School Counseling Praxis Exam 5422 with a score of 153 or higher.
Program requirements must be completed within 6 years.

LICENSURE INFORMATION

Upon successful completion of all program requirements and passing the required Praxis exam, graduates are recommended for professional licensure, including the College and Career Readiness Certificate, through the Utah State Board of Education (USBE)
